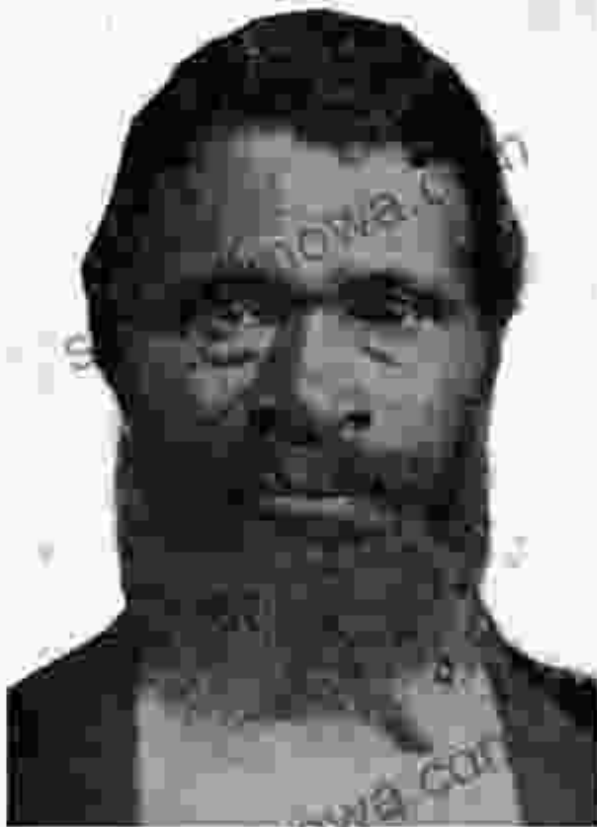


Slave To Time: A Journey Through Slavery and Redemption

DAYTON, OHO, August 7, 1855.

To my Old Master, Colonel R. H. Anderson, Big Spring, Tennessee.

Sar—i got your letter and was glad to find that you had not forgotten Jordan, and that you wanted me to come back and live with you again—promising to do better for me than any body else can. I have often felt uneasy about you. I thought the Yankees would have hung you long before this for harboring the rebs. they found at your house. I suppose they never found out about your going to Colonel Martin's to kill the Union soldier that was left by his company in their stable. Although you shot at me twice before I left you, I did not want to hear of your being hurt, and am glad you are still living. It would do me good to go back to the dear old home again and see Miss Mary and Miss Martin and Allen, Esther, Green and Lee. Give my love to them all, and tell them I hope we will meet in the better world, if not in this. I would have come back to see you
